## **Mists of Recollection**

From March 12th to April 25th 2014 By artist: AmanPreet Badhwar

The exihibition vernissage will be held Wesdnesday March 12 th from 4 to 7 PM

The exhibit Mists of Recollection by artist and neuroscientist AmanPreet Badhwar, takes you on a journey through the mind's eye, exploring our perception of past experiences through misty layers of colour, texture and movement.

Using a process that echoes the layering of memory, Aman uses varied media applied in many layers on paper. The effect is to evoke shifting moods and impressions of people and places, rather than precise, static depictions.

She came to Montreal to study Biology at McGill University. She went on to obtain a Master's degree in Human Genetics and a Doctorate in Neurosciences at McGill, studying Alzheimer's dementia and the effect of therapeutics on memory, brain structure and cerebral blood flow at the Montreal Neurological Institute.

She continues to work on Alzheimer's Disease as a postdoctoral fellow here at the IUGM under the supervision of Professor Rick Hoge.
